RULE

## GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

## BILLS OF LADING - INFORMATION TO BE INCLUDED

1. The Uniform Household Goods Bill of Lading for any shipment accepted for transportation and/or storage shall have printed in bold face on the face thereof a statement reading as follows:

Unless the shipper expressly releases the shipment to a value of 30 cents per pound per article, the mover's maximum liability for loss and damage shall be either the lump sum value declared by the shipper or an amount equal to \$2.00 for each pound of weight in the shipment, whichever is greater.

The shipment shall move subject to the rules and conditions of the mover's tariff. Shipper hereby releases the entire shipment to a value not exceeding. (to be completed by the person signing below)

NOTICE: THE SHIPPER SIGNING THIS CONTRACT SHALL INSERT IN THE SPACE ABOVE, IN HIS OWN HANDWRITING, EITHER HIS DECLARATION OF THE ACTUAL VALUE OF THE SHIPMENT, OR THE WORDS "30 cents per pound per article." OTHERWISE, THE SHIPMENT SHALL BE DEEMED RELEASED TO A MAXIMUM VALUE EQUAL TO \$2.00 TIMES THE WEIGHT OF THE SHIPMENT IN POUNDS.

The shipper, in signing this Bill of Lading, assents to its terms and conditions, if and only if, such terms and conditions are in conformity with law.

2. In addition to the above, the carrier shall include in the Bill of Lading the following minimum information:
- (a) The commodities transported and their weight or the applicable rate for time-rated shipments, the point of origin and destination of such commodities, the names of the consignor and consignee and the charge therefor.
  - (b) Names of the movers participating in the transportation of the shipment.
  - (c) Name, address, and telephone numbers of the office of the mover who should be contacted in relation to the shipment, should there be a need for such contact;
  - (d) Name, address, and telephone number of a person to whom notification of delay in pick-up or delivery shall be given, except when this cannot be obtained from the shipper;
  - (e) (a) Agreed pick-up, (b) the actual pick-up date and (c) agreed to delivery date, or the agreed period of time within which delivery of the shipment is expected at destination;
  - (f) Estimated amount due the mover in cash, bank cashier's check, traveler's check, or postal money order to obtain possession of a COD shipment;
  - (g) A statement that for liability purposes, when no applicable scale weight exists, household goods shall be deemed to weigh 7 pounds per cubic foot;
  - (h) In all other respects, household goods bills of lading shall be governed by the provisions of Title 92 IAC Part 1415, as amended.
