SECTION 1

RULES AND OTHER GOVERNING PROVISIONS

ITEM

GOVERNING PUBLICATIONS

This tariff is governed, except as otherwise provided herein, by the following publications, supplements thereto, or reissues thereof:

MILEAGE GUIDE NO 2-D, MF-IL CC No 288 (to the extent indicated in Rule 9 of IMTBI Tariff 14-G. MF-IL CC 272), issued by Illinois Movers Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent:

PARTICIPATING CARRIER AND SCOPE OF OPERATING RIGHTS TARIFF 10-G, MF-IL CC 287, issued by Illinois Movers Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent;

RULES AND REGULATIONS TARIFF 14-G, MF-IL CC 272, issued by Illinois Movers Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent.

ITEM 2

DEFINITIONS

The term "Holiday" as used herein shall mean the following days will be considered as Holidays:

New Year's Day January 1st Memorial Day last Monday in May Independence Day July 4th Labor Day 1st Monday in September Thanksgiving Day 4th Thursday in November Christmas Day December 25th

ITEM 5

COMMODITY DESCRIPTION

The term "household goods", as used in connection with transportation, means personal effects and property used or to be used in a dwelling, when a part of the equipment or supply of such dwelling, and similar property if the transportation of such effects or property is:

- a) arranged and paid for by the householder, including transportation of property from a factory or store when the property is purchased by the householder with intent to use in his or her dwelling, or
- b) arranged and paid for by another party.

VALUATION CHARGES

Valuation charges provided for in this Item will apply unless shipper expressly releases the shipment to a value not exceeding 30 cents per pound per article.

- On shipments declared or deemed released to a value equal to or exceeding \$2.00 times the actual total shipment weight in pounds, the following valuation charge will apply: 50 cents per each \$100.00 or fraction thereof, of released or declared value.
- On shipments or portions thereof which also involve Storage-In-Transit, the following additional valuation charge will apply: For each storage period of 30 days or fraction thereof, the additional valuation rate of 10% of the applicable Storage-In-Transit rate provided for in Item 115.
- NOTE 1: If the shipper wishes to avoid these additional charges, he must agree that if any articles are lost or damaged, the carrier's liability will not exceed 30 cents per pound for the actual weight for any lost or damaged article(s) in the shipment.
- NOTE 2: Refer to individual carrier pages for any exceptions to this Item.

ITEM 7

MINIMUM PROVISIONS

Applicable minimum provisions named in this tariff concerning time, weight or mileage may be assessed only when carrier, prior to transporting the shipment, has notified the shipper in writing as to the application of such minimum provisions.

ITEM 8

SHORT HAUL ("LOCAL") INVENTORY

When requested by shipper, carrier will prepare an inventory for a short haul shipment, subject to the following:

CW

Shipper must indicate on the bill of lading that a local inventory is requested;

CW

Carrier must notify shipper how the cost of said inventory will be determined, prior to b) performing the inventory;

CW

Charges for performing a local inventory on a regulated short haul shipment (see Item 10) will be considered as part of the time consumed in loading the shipment and will be subject to the applicable hourly rates named in Section 2 (Short Haul Rates).

CW

COLLECTION OF CHARGES

(For informational purposes only)

▲ NOTE 1 - PAYMENT The carrier will not deliver or relinquish possession of any property transported by it until all applicable rates and charges thereon have been paid in cash, money order or certified check, except where other arrangements have been made in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Commission. Rates and charges are stated in lawful money of the United States of America. Payment of all charges must be made in funds of the United States of America. When applicable rates and charges are not paid within 30 calendar days of submission of the bill by carrier, a carrying charge of 1.5% per month or fraction thereof on the unpaid balance shall be applied. ▲Any subsequent debts incurred by the carrier for unpaid bills which are litigated or placed for collection with a collection agency, an attorney, or other authorized agent will also be assessed.

NOTE 2 - CREDIT CARDS When use of a credit card is requested by the party responsible for payment of charges, a fee not to exceed the carrier's cost of acceptance provided by the credit card processor may be added to the moving charges. Notation of the amount to be added to the moving charges will be made on the carrier's estimate, freight bill, and bill of lading. Carrier will support the basis for this amount with an applicable document from the credit card issuer. A separate document verifying the agreement to pay this added fee will be signed and dated by both the carrier and the party responsible for payment. If the party responsible for payment does not wish to pay the added fee for use of a credit card, then payment for moving charges must be made in cash, cashier's check, or money order, or other form of payment agreed to by the carrier in writing in advance of the move. To avoid discrimination in pricing, as required by law, if carrier elects to charge a fee for use of a credit card, all its customers must be billed accordingly.

ITEM 10

APPLICATION OF TARIFF

- Except for shipments transported wholly within Cook County, rates, rules and regulations named in this
 publication will NOT apply on shipments moving wholly between points within the "Terminal area" of any
 incorporated city, village or municipality, as defined in Section 18C-1104 of the Illinois Commercial
 Transportation Law.
 - a) DEFINITION: "Terminal Area" means the area (whether incorporated or unincorporated) within 10 air miles of the corporate limits of the base city, village, municipality or community center, including all of any city, village or municipality which lies within such area.
 - b) DISCLAIMER: Rates, charges, rules and provisions of this publication applying on traffic moving wholly within the exempt area as defined in paragraph a) are published for informational purposes only. Such traffic is not subject to rate regulation by the Illinois Commerce Commission.
- 2) The rates named in this tariff apply only on shipments released at a value not exceeding 30 cents per pound per article (see Item 6 for rates to apply on shipments released at a value exceeding 30 cents per pound per article).
- 3) Except as otherwise provided for in Rule 17 (Storage-In-Transit) of IMTBI Tariff 14-G, (see Item 1 herein), when service is performed the applicable rate or charge to be assessed will be the rate or charge in effect on the day the service is performed.

NON-APPLICATION OF MILEAGE GUIDE

Item 12 previously appeared on Original Page 6

Mileage Guide 2-D (MF-IL CC 288, referred to in Item 1), will not apply on determining mileage on shipments moving wholly within the Chicago Terminal Area (as defined in Section 18C-1104 of the Illinois Commercial Transportation Law). Mileage from and to points and places within the above described area will be the actual miles traveled as recorded on the vehicle's odometer from point or place of origin to point or place of destination, over the shortest available route.

SECTION 2 SHORT HAUL RATES

ITEM 13 APPLICATION OF SHORT HAUL RATES

- 1. Short haul rates named in this Section apply only when:
 - a) the distance from the point of origin to the final destination of a shipment is not more than 35 miles; or
 - b) both the point of origin and the final destination of a shipment are within the area covered by the counties of Cook, DuPage, Kane, Kendall, Lake, McHenry and Will.
- 2. Rates named in this Section do NOT apply on shipments to or from storage for the account of those carriers who participate in Item 300.
- 3. Rates in this Section apply ONLY on shipments released at a value not exceeding 30 cents per pound per article. (See Item 6 for rates to apply on shipments released at a value exceeding 30 cents per pound per article.
- 4. When transporting shipments subject to hourly rates, carrier will make the best practicable effort to determine the number of men and the size and number of vehicles appropriate to provide safe and timely transportation services for the shipment and its particular circumstances. If carrier deviates from its original determination (original written estimate) of men and equipment needs, the shipper shall not be charged for any excess in charges resulting therefrom unless the shipper is informed and agrees thereto in writing. A notation shall be placed on the bill of lading indicating the number of men and vehicles initially estimated and the number actually furnished and used for the move.
- 5. Except as otherwise provided in this paragraph, shipments rated upon units of time shall be transported singly and not commingled with any other freight. If shipments rated upon units of time are commingled, the burden shall be on the carrier to demonstrate that the freight charges for each shipment are not greater than the charges would be for each shipment transported singly.
- 6. Hourly rates, travel time provisions and minimum charge provisions named in Section 2 apply for each man and each vehicle used to complete a move. If a move requires more than one day, these hourly rates, travel time provisions and minimum charge provisions will apply separately for each man and each vehicle used each day.

- 7. Rates and charges named in Section 2 apply only to the extent that specific reference is made for particular carriers in Section 4.
- 8. All hourly rates are computed to the next quarter hour.

ITEM 116 RETENTION ON VAN



When requested by shipper, carrier may permit a shipment, or portions thereof, to remain on its vehicle temporarily prior to delivery subject to the following conditions:

- 1) Shipper must confirm his request to carrier in writing.
- 2) The shipment must not be retained on the carrier's vehicle for more than five (5) days.
- 3) Shipper must agree to provide carrier with written instructions as to where to deliver the shipment if after five days the original destination is unable to accept delivery of the shipment. Instructions must include the complete address of the new destination to one of the following:
 - a) If delivery is to a self-storage facility, the owner of the goods (shipper) must have possession of the key and access to the self-storage facility, and the name of the owner/shipper must appear on the storage contract. The goods may NOT be stored in a self-storage facility rented in the mover's name, orin the name of any person affiliated with the moving company. OR
 - b) If delivery is to a commercial (full-service) warehouse, the warehouse must be licensed by the Illinois Commerce Commission as required by the Illinois Personal Property Storage Act, and a warehouse receipt/storage contract must be completed as required by Ill.C.C. regulations. OR
 - c) A destination identified by the owner of the goods (shipper) except those identified in a) or b) above.
- 4) Charges shall commence the day the shipment is retained on carrier's vehicle and shall include the last day the shipment is retained on carrier's vehicle.
- NOTE 1: Rates in this Item are in dollars and cents and apply per vehicle per day.
- NOTE 2: Rates in this Item also apply in connection with Section 2 rates. •
